CHARACTERISTICS

- Bluish head, black forehead and moustache.
- Bluish back and tail.
- Yellow belly, throat and chest.
- Pale glasses.
- Necklace of black stripes across the chest.



	Mid-May to mid-June
	Late May to July
	June to mid-August
	September to May



HABITAT

- Varied habitats characterized by well-developed shrub and herb layer.
- Moist deciduous and coniferous forests.
- Shrubby vegetation along watercourses.
- Recent cutovers, regenerating forests.
- Nests on the ground in the shrub cover or near woody debris.
- Winters in South America.

THREATS



- Modification of forest structure through reduction or destruction of shrub layer.
- Intensification of agriculture in breeding habitat.
- Decline in insect populations caused by pesticide use.
- Collisions with man-made structures such as communication towers and wind turbines.
- Deforestation and land conversion for agricultural purposes in the wintering area.



Avoid forestry operations during breeding and rearing periods.



Maintain a dense and diverse forest shrub understory.



Follow the recommendations in the *Open environments* and *Woody debris* fact sheets.
