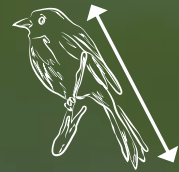


# Eastern wood-pewee

## CHARACTERISTICS

- Olive-gray plumage.
- The size of a house sparrow.
- Characteristic song (*pee-ah-wee*).



May



June – Early August



Mid-June to late August



Late October to mid-May

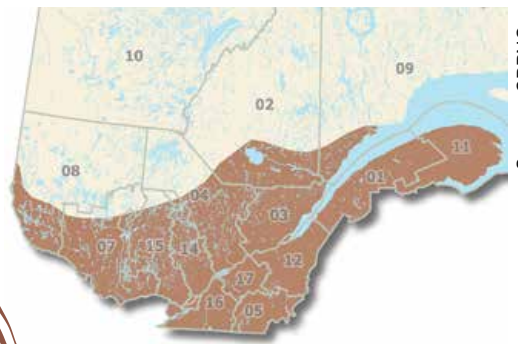


## HABITAT

- Habitat mosaic characterized by mature stands of deciduous or mixed forests with sparse understory and clearings.
- Forest edges.
- Nests on tree branches.
- Feeds on insects in trees.
- Winters in South America.



## DISTRIBUTION IN QUEBEC

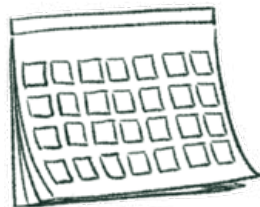

## THREATS

- Loss of mature forest environments.
- Decline in insect populations caused by pesticide use.
- Nest predation (blue jays and red squirrels).
- Residential development: reduced availability and quality of mature forest environments.



Avoid forestry operations during breeding and rearing periods.
