



Blanding's turtle

Threatened in Quebec – Endangered in Canada



CHARACTERISTICS



- Black to dark brown domed carapace.
- Pale flecks on carapace.
- Throat and chin bright yellow.



Hibernation

October to April



Late August to late October and late April to early May



June to September-October

Activities away from water

May 1 to June 24

HABITAT



- Marshes and swamps.
- Ponds.
- Shallow lakes.
- Flooded lands.



THREATS



- Fragmentation and habitat loss.
- Road mortality.
- Dismantling or breaking of beaver dams during the cold season, resulting in drying of ponds where beavers hibernate and death of individuals.
- Beaver eradication in turtle habitat.

IN THE 240 METRES BUFFER ZONE

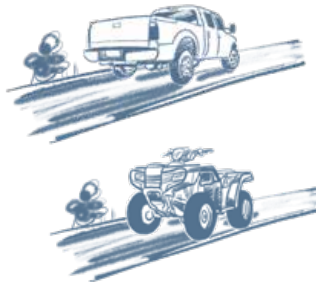


Maintain a forested riparian buffer strip. Consult municipal by-laws for permitted widths and harvesting rates.



Don't eradicate beavers: apply sound practices for managing beaver populations and their dams.

Prefer the installation of water level control structures.



Reduce speed and increase vigilance on roads between May 1 and June 24, to avoid collisions with turtles.



Where possible, avoid building new roads.
